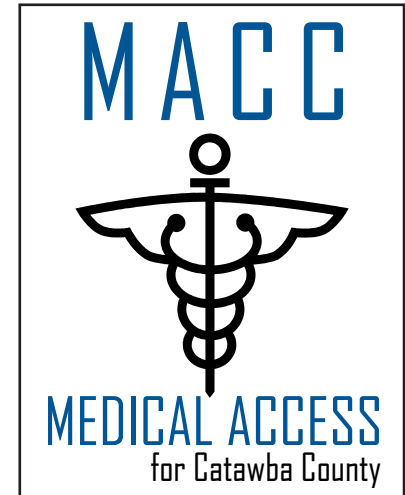

The Mission of MACC

To coordinate a volunteer network of Catawba County physicians working together as a “safety net” to deliver chronic disease management for uninsured residents.

About the MACC Program

Medical Access for Catawba County, or MACC, is a community initiative spearheaded by the Catawba County Medical Society and Catawba County Health Partners.

MACC is a partnership comprised of local medical care providers, area hospitals, colleges, human service agencies and free or reduced healthcare clinics.



In 2004, there were approximately 18,349 uninsured people between the ages of 18 and 64 in Catawba County (nearly 1 in 5 adults).

MACC Goals

The goals of the MACC program are to:

- Improve health outcomes for uninsured residents.
- Decrease the use of emergency rooms for non-emergent care by the uninsured.
- Increase primary care and specialty care for uninsured residents.
- Increase volunteerism and collaboration of the health care community.

MACC Patient Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for the MACC program, the patient must be:

- A Catawba County resident for three consecutive months.
- An uninsured adult between the ages of 18-64.
- Below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level, determined through MACC eligibility screening.
- In need of Chronic Disease Management, specifically COPD, Diabetes, Heart Disease and/or Hypertension by MACC's referring partners.
